IPCC releases its 2015/16 Report - Improvement suggestions help prevent and reduce complaints

(HONG KONG – 7 December 2016) The Independent Police Complaints Council (IPCC) today released its 2015/16 Report, the seventh report since it had become an independent statutory body in June 2009.

"In the aftermath of the Occupy Movement, public order events and confrontations between the Police and citizens still arose throughout the past year. Although the number of complaints against the Police has dropped, the complexity of these cases and more often the attention drawn by the community on them brought a lot of challenges to the IPCC's work," said Mr Larry Kwok, Chairman of the IPCC.

During the reporting period of 2015/16, the IPCC received reports from Complaints Against Police Office (CAPO) on the investigations of 1,572 new cases, 27% less than that of the previous year, marking a reduction for the second consecutive year. In the same period, the IPCC endorsed 1,784 complaint cases with a year-on-year drop of approximately 20%. The allegations endorsed by the IPCC saw a year-on-year decrease of around 18%, totaling 3,360. The three most common allegations were "Neglect of Duty" (1,528 counts, 45.5%), "Misconduct/ Improper Manner/ Offensive Language" (1,107 counts, 32.9%) and "Assault" (346 counts, 10.3%).

In the investigation results endorsed by the IPCC, 163 allegations were classified as "Substantiated", "Substantiated Other Than Reported" or "Not Fully Substantiated". These three classifications, indicating different degrees of misconduct committed by police officers, accounted for approximately 5% of all allegations, representing a slight increase of about 1% compared to that of last year. Besides, the 1,213 allegations classified under "Not Pursuable" made up the largest share of the total endorsed investigations results at about 36%. It is worth to note that there is an upward trend in this figure in recent years. (*Please refer to Annex I for more statistics*)

Mr Richard Yu, Secretary-General of the IPCC, said, "The Council recognized that most of the 'Not Pursuable' cases were untraceable as the complainants did not

provide valid contact methods when lodging complaints; or they failed to respond to CAPO's attempts to contact them by telephone, e-mail and post. It is hoped that the public will understand that while it is voluntary for the complainant to supply information, it would greatly assist CAPO and IPCC in handling complaints in a fair, just and efficient manner if the information provided was accurate and genuine."

In discharging one of its statutory functions in the IPCC Ordinance, the Council has also recommended improvements to police practices and procedures in this reporting period. Of the 17 improvements suggested by the IPCC, 10 were related to the handling of public order events and they were fully accepted by CAPO. These recommendations are conducive to rectifying any fault or deficiency in police procedures, thereby reducing potential complaints.

The Chairman of the IPCC, Mr Kwok further commented that, "The Council will continue to actively communicate with a wider community in the hope that the public will have a proper understanding of the statutory functions and vetting procedures of the IPCC. I would also like to thank all the serving and retired members as well as the Secretariat for their contribution to safeguard a fair and impartial police complaints system and to uphold IPCC's core values of independence, impartiality and integrity."

The IPCC has become a statutory body since the commencement of IPCCO on 1 June 2009.
